## SOMEONE IS WATCHING US: DRONES AND PRIVACY

***Summary:** Drones (UAVs) present unique privacy challenges due to the manner in which they may collect information. As their number and popularity grow daily and their field of application expands, the risk of violating an individual's privacy and personal data becomes increasing. This is evidenced by numerous examples of violations of these assets that occur in countries worldwide caused by the use of drones.*

*The rules on the use of drones in Bosnia and Herzegovina came into force less than two years ago, and the process of amending regulations for protecting privacy and personal rights has not yet been completed.*

*The paper analyzes the provisions of international and Bosnian regulations of drones and examines the extent to which current regulations on privacy and personal data protection in Bosnia and Herzegovina can respond to the challenges posed by the use of drones for various purposes.*
